The Hearst Elementary PTA is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization designed, in part, to enhance the education and cultural experiences of its approximately 300 students from the pre-k4 through 5<sup>th</sup> grade levels and autism program. Hearst is located within the physical boundary of ANC3F. Hearst completed the renovation of its existing building of classrooms in the summer of 2014. The second phase of construction (approximately 10 new classrooms, administrative spaces, etc) was completed in December 2014. The third phase of construction (to include a new library, gymnasium, music room and stage, etc) is planned for completion in August 2015.

The completion of the third phase of construction will produce the opportunity to finally house a complete library in the proper physical space. Although Hearst and Librarian maintain a fine library, financed in part by Hearst PTA fundraisers and a new budget allocation from DCPS, the purpose of the grant will be to develop and maintain the requisite level of a broad spectrum of “series books” to address the developing reading needs and interests of the students. The Library serves the day to day needs of the teachers, the teaching needs of the librarian who performs special pull out sessions for each classroom – including research and suggesting books at targeted reading levels, and most importantly the children that are introduced to a lifetime of reading and learning. The purchase of these additional “series books” will specifically address the identified approach of involving young students in an on-going exchange of ideas and challenges associated with a series of books by one author. This approach has been demonstrated to achieve increased reading comprehension.

Attached is an itemized list of anticipated books planned for purchase through the grant, geared toward both grade and reading levels. The timeline for this project will be based on when the grant is approved by the ANC, a check delivered to the PTA, and the subsequent purchase of the books. Ideally the PTA may purchase these books in August 2015 with a delivery of the new books to Hearst (and installation in the sparkling new library) in September. Once the books have been purchased the receipt(s) will be delivered to the ANC for accounting purposes. The applicant will keep the ANC apprised should there be a slight delay of book ordering due to any slight delays in the completion of the building of the new library.
