

### Storm Water Mitigation in Forest Hills

### Organization Description

Hillwood Estate, Museum & Gardens' mission is to delight and engage visitors with an experience inspired by the life of founder Marjorie Merriweather Post and her passion for excellence, gracious hospitality, art, history, and gardens. Marjorie Merriweather Post (1885-1973) was heir to the Post Cereal Companies and a successful businesswoman, generous philanthropist, and fashion icon. Upon her death, she left her 25-acre estate in Washington, D.C. and its collections as a gift for the enjoyment and edification of future generations. In accordance with her wishes, Hillwood opened to the public in 1977. Akin to the many and varied aspects of Marjorie Post's life, Hillwood offers a multifaceted experience appealing to visitors of all ages and diverse interests. The estate comprises a Georgian-style Mansion, twelve outbuildings, themed gardens, and woodlands located in Forest Hills.

### Community Support for the Project

The proposed project is supported by Commissioner Pat Jakopchek and the DC Metro Trail District of the Potomac Appalachian Trail Club (PATC), led by District Manager Alex Sanders. Leah Lemoine, former Environmental Protection Specialist at the District Department of the Environment Watershed Protection Division, also encouraged this project.

### **Project Description**

Hillwood respectfully requests a grant of \$3,000 from the Advisory Neighborhood Commission 3F for slope stabilization and storm water mitigation in the northwest quadrant of Hillwood's property in the Forest Hills neighborhood. The project will help protect private and public lands which are currently vulnerable to erosion.

Sloping land on the northwest quadrant of Hillwood forms a gulley adjacent to publically owned lands in Rock Creek Park, containing trails managed by the PATC and the National Park Service. Both Hillwood's property and the public trails are threatened by the volume and velocity of storm water that collects and follows the course of the gulley. Hillwood proposes a project that will mitigate the effects of storm water runoff in this area. Anti-erosion jute matting will be applied along the slope to hold topsoil in place and allow new plants to root properly. Filtrexx® SiltSoxx<sup>TM</sup>, which are tubular sediment control and storm water filtration devices, will be used to redirect storm water runoff and reduce its velocity. Coconut fiber rolls will be staked in place at the toe of the slope, preventing shallow slides while collecting sediment that allows for plant propagation. Hillwood will add several species of deep-rooted, native plants to the area. The jute matting and coconut rolls will facilitate plant growth and then slowly biodegrade after several years, leaving behind established plants which are the best defense against erosion. The biodegradable materials will provide an immediate fix to the problem, while mature deep-rooted plants deliver a long-term solution.

#### **Public Benefits**

This project provides a cost-effective, lasting solution to the problem of acute storm water runoff in this area and protects public trails threatened by erosion — particularly Soapstone Valley Trail. The gulley has been identified as a major area of need by the PATC and the Horticulture Department at Hillwood. The area is extremely vulnerable to mudslides and if a major event occurred, the problem would be much more costly and complex to fix. This practical mitigation project will save public funds by preventing erosion that could create the need for major clean up, landscape engineering, and trail reconstruction projects in the future. The project will better position the PATC to maintain Soapstone Valley Trail. They will be able to move forward with improvements that have been previously unviable due to the conditions created by erosion in this area. Residents and visitors to the Forest Hills neighborhood will benefit from safe, useable trails in this portion of Rock Creek Park.

Hillwood respectfully requests a grant of \$3,000 to complete this project. Though Hillwood is not seeking funding from additional sources, this project capitalizes on Hillwood's existing horticultural expertise, staff, and equipment. No additional consultation or contract labor will be necessary. Grant funding from ANC 3F will only be used to purchase new materials and plants for this project.

#### ANC Involvement

Commissioners have been informed of this project and have taken part in meetings with Hillwood staff to discuss its development, but no ANC 3F commissioners are directly or indirectly involved with the implementation of this project.

### **Previous ANC Funding**

Hillwood has not received any previous funding from ANC 3F.

#### Timetable

Hillwood will begin the project as soon as the ANC provides their decision, and will complete all work before December 31, 2015.

We have received your notification of intent to terminate your private foundation status under section 507(b)(1)(B) of the Internal Revenue Code during a 60 month period beginning January 1, 2014.

The information submitted indicates that you intend to operate as an organization described in sections 509(a)(1) and 170(b)(1)(A)(vi) of the Code during the 60 month period.

Based on your proposed activities and support, it is held that you can reasonably be expected to terminate your private foundation status under section 507(b)(1)(B) of the Code. Accordingly, you will be treated as a public charity described in sections 509(a)(1) and 170(b)(1)(A)(vi) of the Code for an advance ruling period of 60 months beginning January 1, 2014.

Within 90 days after the end of your 60 month period, you must establish to the satisfaction of the Internal Revenue Service that you have qualified as an organization which meets the requirements of paragraph (1), (2), or (3) of section 509(a) of the Code for the 60 month period. If you do establish that fact, you will be so classified for all purposes beginning with the first day of the first taxable year of the 60 month period and, thereafter, so long as you continue to meet the requirements of section 509(a)(1), (2), or (3). If, however, you do not meet these requirements for the 60 month period, you will be classified as a private foundation as of the first day of the first taxable year of the 60 month period.

If you satisfy the requirements of section 507(b)(1)(B) of the Code at the end of your 60 month period, you will not be subject to the provisions of section 507(a), (c), or (g) of the Code.

Grantors and donors may rely on the determination that you are not a private foundation until 90 days after the end of your advance ruling period. If you submit the required information within the 90 days, grantors and contributors may continue to rely on the advance determination until the Service makes a final determination of your foundation status.
