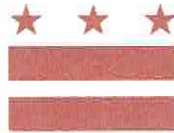

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**RESOLUTION REGARDING THE STORM WATER AND HYDROLOGY AT HEARST PARK AND
IDAHO AVENUE RIGHT OF WAY**

January 16, 2018

WHEREAS, As part of ANC 3F's oversight of the Hearst Park renovation, and by referencing ANC 3F adopted Resolutions (attached and incorporated into this Resolution), ANC 3F continues to believe that public coordination between DGS, DPR, DOEE, and DDOT, along with the National Park Service, and with ANC 3F and nearby communities, will ensure that all applicable Storm Water Management, Heritage Tree, and other environmental regulations will be achieved, while giving proper consideration to the various uses of Hearst Park, including community design and performance preferences.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that ANC 3F requests

1. That the DC City Council and Mayor Bowser mandate DDOT, and sufficiently appropriate funds, to develop and implement a stormwater management plan, in accordance with the 2013 Storm Water Management regulations, for the Idaho Avenue Right of Way (ROW), and that a required ROW project be established in order to install a natural walking path or similar features (with community input), along with a rehabilitation of the forested area on the ROW;
2. That DPR and DGS provide the community, through public meeting, and through documentation posted on DGS's website, a description of the storm water management plan, that retains stormwater on the Hearst Park site and which will reduce storm water flooding in Hearst Park, the ROW, Springland Lane, and Melvin Hazen Park (between Reno Road and Connecticut Ave NW – MHP);
3. That DPR and DGS fully describe the different storm water management techniques (including both green and gray designs, including cisterns, bio swales, soil conditioning, etc.) that are being considered for Hearst Park and the ROW, and how such techniques will affect the balance of using the soccer field for as much time as possible while mitigating adverse effects on Springland Lane (including the natural springs on Springland Lane) and MHP (and ensuring sufficient water and/or runoff for such areas);
4. That DPR and DGS provide the community, through public meeting, and through documentation posted on DGS's website, a description of the natural grasses or natural turf that will be employed on the soccer field, along with planned soil conditioning and/or sprinklers, that will ensure the durability of the playing field while addressing proper drainage;

5. That DGS, DPR, DOEE, DDOT, in consultation with the National Park Service, as a follow up to the meeting organized by ANC 3F's Soapstone Valley & Melvin C. Hazen Parks and Trails Committee meeting in November, 2017, conduct another meeting with the Committee to explain the relationship(s) between the planned projects (and options) at Hearst Park and the ROW, with the effects on the overall hydrology of Springland Lane and MHP, as well as ensuring no adverse effects on the heritage trees at Hearst Park; and
6. That DOEE continue to advise DGS, DPR, and DDOT during the design phases of Hearst Park and the ROW, and advise ANC 3F of its determination regarding the interpretation and applicable of the Storm Water Management rules to the Hearst Park and ROW designs before DOEE's approval of such plans.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Commissioners Dickinson and Jakopchek are authorized to speak on behalf of ANC 3F regarding this matter.

ANC 3F PASSED this resolution at its meeting on January 16, 2018, which was properly noticed and at which a quorum was present, by a vote of 7 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining.
